

## Set-up and breakdown

- Set-up starts Friday, 10/9 at 12pm on. All camps must be ready to go no later than 9am on Saturday.
- Breakdown starts on Sunday, 10/11 at 4:30pm once the event is over. Breakdown must be complete no later than Monday, 10/12 at 12pm.
- Highest authenticity standards apply and no non-period tents are allowed in the civilian camp area. And all non-period items will be concealed or hidden from view at all times.

## Facility

- For those with non-canvas tents or RVs who plan to spend the night, there is an area on the far south grounds where you can camp and park.
- There are both women's and men's restrooms with hot and cold running water and flush toilets. There are NO showers.
- There is one handicapped Porta-toilet that will be situated on the edge of the living history camp.
- All fires are "above the ground" (12") above the grass. No fires are unattended, so they must be put out with water if done cooking or warming.  
A bucket of water is to be next to any fire at all times.
- All clean-up and trash removal is the responsibility of each group.
- The gates to the grounds close daily at 4pm and open at 6am. There will be a person on-site to grant access outside of those hours. Access will be coordinated through Jon Reed (Military Organizer) and Shelley Peters (Civilian Camp Coordinator).
- Food vendor available from 11am-3pm on Saturday and 11am-3pm on Sunday.
- A first-aid area will be located on the lower grounds just west of the battlefield.

## Participants

- All participants setting up camps must send in contact information and size requirements 1 week prior to the event.
- All participants will be required to fill out a registration form and a guardian must sign for any minors.
- There is a free lunch provided both days to registered reenactors upon proof of liability form being signed (tickets will be issued when form is received).
- NO alcohol is allowed on the grounds and this will be required sign-off on the registration form.
- NO participant will be allowed to sell anything such as merchandise, arms, equipment etc. Only authorized sutlers and food vendors will be allowed to sell inside the grounds.
- Commemorative ribbon will be given to each group.

## Military

- NO LIVE AMMUNITION is allowed.... not even for demonstration purposes.

- All weapons and ammunition used will be inspected by the event coordinator for safety and authenticity.
- All weapons must pass a safety test before engaging in combat.
