10am to 4pm: Continuous living history camps, vendors, demonstrations, and tours of the history Adobe (upper grounds). Visit our Gift Shop! Pick up your scavenger hunt to play and learn about the "Find the Rancho Steer" game as well. The winner of that game is announced at 3:30pm.

Starting at 10am, learn to make adobe bricks, sew on antique sewing machines, learn about roping and how to make corn husk dolls and handkerchief dolls, make paper flowers at Mrs. Brewster's parlor, and have fun in the children's games and pastimes.

Meet people from the 1800s such as the Dominguez sisters, musicians, U.S. military and Californio soldiers, seamstresses, crafts people, cooks, chaplain and more. Learn about cooking, spinning, lace making, and sewing. Visit a mercantile, parlor and book shop, working community smokehouse, frontier camps, jail and learn about all the details of pioneer life.
